A PROCLAMATION

ASIAN-PACIFIC AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH

- WHEREAS:** The Peach State is fortunate to be home to over 300,000 citizens with Asian-Pacific American heritage. According to the U.S. Census, this community is one of the most diverse and fast-growing groups in the United States; and
- WHEREAS:** Asian-Pacific Americans are those who trace their national origins back to one of more than fifty countries in the Asian continent or Pacific Islands, including Bangladesh, Bhutan, The Philippines, Samoa, Singapore, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand, and Vietnam; and
- WHEREAS:** Asian-Pacific Americans have contributed to all facets of life in Georgia, including arts, culture, heritage and history preservation, government, business, education, and philanthropies; and
- WHEREAS:** During the observance of Asian-Pacific American Heritage Month, we celebrate the traditions, native languages, and unique experiences represented by Asian-Pacific Americans both across our country and right here in Georgia; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 2021 as ASIAN-PACIFIC AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH in Georgia.
