A PROCLAMATION

CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

- WHEREAS:** Children's mental health is the heart of wellness in Georgia communities; and
- WHEREAS:** One in four children and adolescents in Georgia would benefit from mental health treatment; and
- WHEREAS:** One in ten children in Georgia suffers from serious emotional and mental health disorders that, when left untreated, cause significant functional impairment in their day-to-day lives at home, in school and with peers; and
- WHEREAS:** Most children and adolescents with mental disorders do not receive treatment, leaving them at an increased risk of school drop-out, involvement in the juvenile justice system, and negative life outcomes; and
- WHEREAS:** With early and appropriate treatment, these children and youth can build productive and satisfying lives; and
- WHEREAS:** It is important that children and adolescents, along with their families and communities, learn about the warning signs of mental health disorders and how to obtain necessary treatment and support; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim May 3-7, 2021, as CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK in Georgia.
