



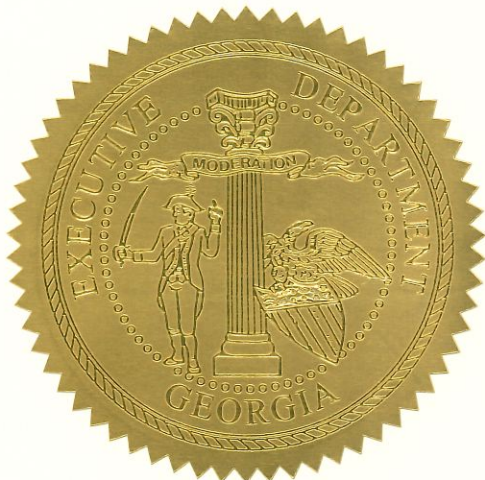

CLASSICS WEEK

- WHEREAS:** The Classics and classical antiquity continue to play an important role in modern society—from government and laws to literature and language and arts; and
- WHEREAS:** The Georgia Junior Classical League is committed to furthering education in the Classics while bettering the future of American communities—through educational ventures, publicity activities, and community service endeavors; and
- WHEREAS:** Throughout the State of Georgia, there are 35 chapters comprised of 1383 high school Latin, Greek, and Classics students; and
- WHEREAS:** The members of the Georgia Junior Classical League recognize the positive influence of classical culture upon our society by giving back to their communities in affirmation of the classical principle that good citizenship is inseparable from education; and
- WHEREAS:** Georgia Classics Week is held in commemoration of the traditional “birthday” of Rome—April 21st—offering the opportunity to promote and connect with the legacies of Greece and Rome; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim April 17-23, 2023, as CLASSICS WEEK in Georgia.
