A PROCLAMATION

HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR DAY

- WHEREAS:** The Jewish Federation of Greater Atlanta and Jewish Family & Career Services assist with the care of Holocaust survivors in the Georgia community to provide quality care for Holocaust survivors; and
- WHEREAS:** The State of Georgia celebrates Holocaust survivors on Holocaust Survivor Day to recognize survivors for their strength and resilience; and
- WHEREAS:** The State of Georgia honors Holocaust survivors, and the caring professionals and volunteers who work to care for Holocaust survivors in their final years; and
- WHEREAS:** The State of Georgia honors the Holocaust survivors, as well as the many individuals and groups who engage in programs, activities, and outreach to provide precious care; and have demonstrated their spirit of compassion and kindness and their genuine concern for the well-being of Holocaust survivors; and
- WHEREAS:** Holocaust Survivor Day will be held on Friday June 2, 2023. On this occasion, it is fitting that recognition be given to Holocaust survivors to celebrate survivors' lives, thank survivors for their contributions, their lessons, and the examples they have set for generations to come; now
- THEREFORE:** I, BRIAN P. KEMP, Governor of the State of Georgia, do hereby proclaim June 2, 2023, as HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR DAY in Georgia.
